Year 2003 to 2006 the Department was run by contributory lecturers as appointment could not be made due to Non-availability of N.O.C.

In the year 2006 Dr. Mrs. Renu A. Tiwari joined the college subsequently in 2008 Dr. Siddharth H. Meshram joined the department and working since then.

A workshop had been conducted with collaboration of Sociology Department on "Social and Economical thought of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar" in 1991.
